PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- The MSN-ENP program is tailor-made for students holding non-nursing bachelor's degrees but who want to become registered nurses.
- This accelerated 24-month, full-time nursing program
 will prepare students with the experience to graduate as
 a master's prepared RN. Graduates are eligible to sit for
 the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered
 Nurses; (NCLEX-RN).
- Through our interprofessional education program, students gain the experience and leadership skills to become a leader in the nursing profession.
- Clinical rotations include a variety of clinical settings, such as **hospitals**, **clinics and long-term care facilities**.
