Sophia Gallucio is honored for her outstanding service, leadership, and dedication to teaching at CMS. A devoted mentor and student leader, she has supported her peers at every level while advancing health equity and community engagement. Her commitment to family medicine and to uplifting others has made a lasting impact. Sophia matched into Family Medicine at Long Beach Memorial Medical Center, CA.



Aayush Gupta is honored for his passionate leadership and enduring impact on CMS and the surrounding community. He founded the Chicago Street Medicine chapter at RFU and co-established the ICC's first Psychiatry Service, expanding care for vulnerable populations while strengthening institutional partnerships. Aayush matched into Psychiatry at Case Western University Hospitals, Cleveland Medical, OH.



Neil Kelekar is recognized for his sustained leadership and deep commitment to CMS. An active member of the Curriculum Committee and contributor to the Step 1 Performance Review Task Force, he has helped shape meaningful academic reforms, while also serving as President of the Gold Humanism Honor Society. Neil matched into Medicine-Preliminary at Medical College Wisconsin, Affiliate Hospitals.



Caroline Madigan is recognized for her transformative leadership and extraordinary service to CMS. 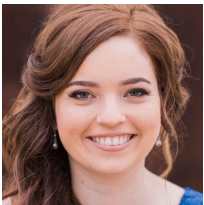
The Martin Gecht Memorial '44 Endowed Award recognizes a CMS student's effort in community service projects including leadership, community development, and service to underserved populations.



Gloria Essien is recognized for her outstanding community-centered leadership and dedication to health equity. She revitalized the Interprofessional Community Clinic Pelvic Health Panel, leading a needs survey that laid the groundwork for the clinic's successful launch, and has empowered underrepresented middle school students through Mini Medical School. Gloria's service extends beyond clinical leadership, including her work addressing food insecurity with Sistas In The Village and coordinating the "Flowing Compassion" menstrual product drive.

The Dr. Ronald Bangasser Memorial Award recognizes a CMS student's effort in community service projects including leadership, community development, and service to underserved populations.

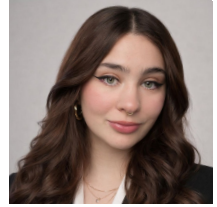


Nikki Barrington Zimmer is recognized for her visionary leadership and steadfast service to Chicago Medical School and the Interprofessional Community Clinic. She helped design the clinic's enduring organizational framework and is now preserving its legacy by creating the first comprehensive record of ICC volunteers. Through mentorship, public health expertise, and a constant clinical presence, Nikki has built an infrastructure that enables her peers and the community to thrive.

Nikki matched into Medicine-Preliminary at MedStar Union Memorial Hospital, MD, and Johns Hopkins Hospital, MD, for Neurology.

The Melvyn Leichtling, MD '48 Oncology Research Award was established in 1977 to assist students who submit an outstanding research proposal related to the field of oncology.

Mary Nellett's research, titled "*Determining the Role of Aquaporins in the Expression of Costimulatory Molecules in Kaposi's Sarcoma-associated Herpesvirus (KSHV)-Infected Macrophages,*" explored how Aquaporins influence immune signaling in KSHV, a virus linked to cancers such as Kaposi's Sarcoma. She examined the role of these proteins in regulating costimulatory molecules essential for T-cell activation and effective anti-tumor responses. Her findings suggest that Aquaporins may play a key role in immune modulation during KSHV infection and represent promising targets for future cancer therapies.



The MD with Distinction in Research recognizes students who initiate and complete an original independent research project during their tenure at CMS. Students perform the research under the guidance of a faculty supervisor at RFU or another university. The student is further mentored by a Research Committee composed of 3 RFU faculty members with expertise in the specific topic. The MDDR is granted upon submission of a first-author manuscript and successful oral defense before the Research Committee.



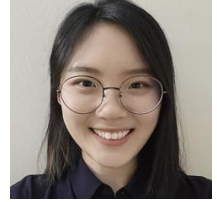
Rebecca (Bella) Silver successfully defended her thesis, "*Integrative Genomic Profiling of Newly Diagnosed Prostate Cancers Progressing on Surveillance,*" conducted under the mentorship of Adam Sowalsky, PhD, at the National Cancer Institute. Her research advanced understanding of the genomic factors involved in prostate cancer progression during active surveillance. Ms. Silver's research committee included Drs. Justin Whalley, Judy Potashkin, and Neelam Sharma-Walia.



Reina Nagasaka successfully defended her thesis, "*Acute Effects of Percutaneous Coronary Intervention on Neutrophil Activation and Maturity Markers in Coronary and Peripheral Circulation,*" based on research conducted under the mentorship of Matthew Feinstein, MD, at Northwestern University. Her work advanced understanding of immune and inflammatory responses following coronary intervention. Ms. Nagasaka's research committee included Drs. Eugene Dimitrov, Fabio Re, and Amita Thakerar Patel.

The John J. Sheinin, MD, PhD, DSC Memorial Research Award is presented for originality and creativity in a research project conducted while a medical student.

Third year medical student, **Isabella “Bella” Han**, is recognized for her originality and sustained scholarly productivity. Selected to represent CMS at the Alpha Omega Alpha Research Fellowship in 2025, she has continued to advance innovative work. Her project, *“Alternative DNA Structures in Hematopoiesis and Adaptive Immunity,”* reflects creativity and scientific rigor, embodying the spirit of this award.



The Ronald M. Reifler Primary Care Award is awarded to a graduate who will continue their career in primary care.



Recipient, **John “Jack” Hill**, distinguished himself through his stalwart commitment to preventive medicine and service to underserved communities. His passion for primary care, first sparked in childhood, has guided his academic focus and professional path. Throughout medical school, he has aligned his coursework, leadership, and service with a mission to expand access and advance health equity.

Jack matched into Family Medicine at the University of Chicago Medical Center, IL.

The 2026 Excellence in Public Health Award (USPHS) recognizes a medical student for outstanding involvement in community public health efforts while promoting awareness of the U.S. Public Health Service’s mission to protect and advance the nation’s health.



Kayla Talebi is recognized for her outstanding commitment to advancing public health through leadership, research, and community partnership. THE DECLARATION OF GENEVA

As a member of the medical profession:

I solemnly pledge to dedicate my life to the service of humanity; the health and well-being of my patient will be my first consideration;

I will respect the autonomy and dignity of my patient;

I will maintain the utmost respect for human life;

I will not permit considerations of age, disease or disability, creed, ethnic origin, gender, nationality, political affiliation, race, sexual orientation, social standing, or any other factor to intervene between my duty and my patient;

I will respect the secrets that are confided in me, even after the patient has died;

I will practice my profession with conscience and dignity and in accordance with good medical practice;

I will foster the honor and noble traditions of the medical profession; I will give to my teachers, colleagues, and students the respect and gratitude that is their due;

I will share my medical knowledge for the benefit of the patient and the advancement of healthcare;

I will attend to my own health, well-being, and abilities in order to provide care of the highest standard;

I will not use my medical knowledge to violate human rights and civil liberties, even under threat;

I make these promises solemnly, freely, and upon my honor.
