

## CRRSA Act Reporting (HEERF II)

*The following information must be presented publicly in a location that is easily accessible to the public by no later than June 30, 2021. The following information will be updated every 45 days thereafter.*

### TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

In compliance with the reporting requirements for CRRSA Act Funding for Students, RFU acknowledges that it has signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement with the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, all funds allocated for the Emergency Financial Aid Grants received under the CRRSA Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

RFU students were notified of the availability of emergency grant funds via an email update sent to students by Rebecca L. Durkin, Vice President, Student Success, and Inclusion on March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The notice directed students to an [online application](#) for emergency grant funds. The email notice provided general information regarding the availability of the emergency grant funds.

Each application was reviewed to ensure that each applicant had a valid FAFSA on file and that the student was eligible for Title IV federal financial aid. Student applications were reviewed, and students awarded emergency grants ranging from \$500 to \$1,500 in emergency assistance.

The total amount of fund received by RFU for HEERF II (Student Portion): **\$300,296**

As of June 2021, Rosalind Franklin University has drawn down and issued **\$266,251** dollars in Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. RFU is continuing to receive applications and will continue to make awards with the remaining funds within our eligible timeframe. At the time document was published, RFU has **\$34,045** in remaining HEERF II funding to be awarded.
