VISA: The **only visa** that will be acceptable for CMS residencies and fellowships is **J-1 visa**.

SALARIES: Salary levels for each postgraduate year of training are determined in the Spring preceding the academic year of training. The salary levels for the current academic year (AY 2026-27) are given below.

PGY 4: \$73,072
PGY 5: \$74,915
PGY 6: \$77,070

SALARY AND BENEFITS

- a. **Salary:** Each resident is assigned to the payroll of the Medical School or of an affiliated medical center. The salary and benefits package is competitive with the regional hospitals and is adjusted annually with the approval of the School's GME Committee. Salaries and Benefits may be updated before publication of the next version of GME Manual.
- b. **Health Insurance:** Subject to eligibility requirements of the plan and enrollment by the resident, health insurance is available through the Medical School or medical center that employs the resident. Details of the available insurance plans are presented and discussed with each resident at the time of appointment.

Benefits include Health Insurance, Life Insurance, Professional Liability (Malpractice) Insurance, and provisions for Disability Insurance. Details of coverage depend upon the plans selected from among the options available at the Medical School or at Mount Sinai Hospital. Professional Liability Insurance includes coverage of at least \$1,000,000 per event and \$3,000,000 in annual aggregate, with "tail coverage." Annual leave for vacation is up to four weeks per academic year and is accrued on the basis of days in pay status during the same academic year. Except in extraordinary circumstances, unused accrued vacation is not carried over into subsequent academic years and is subject to forfeiture if not used.

Additional leave policies and other policies, are included in the "Manual of Policies and Procedures for Graduate Medical Programs" and the "Residency and Fellowship Agreement".
